Particle simulation using barometric "Biden-differentials" to predict future showers

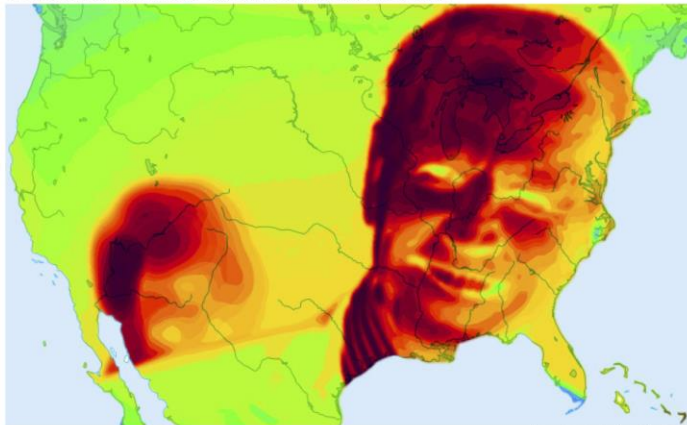
